Concert In Review:

A March Thodi evening.....

It was one of those bright days in March when the weather was very pleasant and the audience was treated with a pleasant experience of a delightful vocal concert by Mr. Siddharth Kumar. He was accompanied by Kamal Kiran Vinjumori on the violin, Ajay Ravichandhran on the mridangam and Vivek Chellapa on Kanjira. This was held in Rama and Murali's

residence in North Potomac, MD on March 20th.

Siddharth started off with an Ata-tala Varnam in Reethi Gowlai that set a beautiful precedent of what was to

follow. Then a not so often heard Syama Sasthri Krithi, Pahimam Janani in Nattai followed by crisp swarams. This paved the way for a beatiful Lathagi Alapana - he really excelled in the higher octaves - Kamal Kiran followed with a beautiful response. Siddharth rendered the all popular Papanasam Sivan Krithi Venkataramana followed with swarams.

The fourth offering was another nice selection of popular kriti Mokshamu Galatha in raga Saramathi set to Adi tala - this was preceded by a quick alapana. This bought out the bakthi and emotions that the song is so laden with. Then followed a racy Bogindhra Sayinam in Kunthalavarali in Tala Kanda Chapu by Swathi Thirunal.

This was followed by the piece de resistance and the main offering in Raga Thodi - an elobrate alapana (which included Graha Bedham) bought out the emotions that only a Raga like Thodi can bring and Siddharth did full justice to it. He was well assisted in the violin. Muthuswami Dikshithar's Shri Krishnam, Tala: Adi followed with Neravals and Swarams taking the concert to a crescendo. Special mention must be made about the thani performed by the Ajay and Vivek. I felt the Siddharth's rendition of Thodi reminded me a lot of TNS's rendition of Thodi.

This followed by a quick Oothukadu krithi Alayipayuthe in Kanada. The final piece was a pleasant Thillana in Bhimplas by Swathi Thirunal followed by Managalam. Siddharth ensured that he covered the breath of composers.

It was quite an experience to the audience that these young artists not only gave high quality performance but also assured the future of Carnatic music is bright and strong in their hands. The organizers have to be congratulated for organizing this unique event celebrating young carnatic musicians and the great spiritual path of music.
